Foundation 1: Autumn 1

Below are some ideas for your child's homework linked to our topic 'Traditional Tales'. **These can be completed in any order** and evidenced in your child's homework book (for example, your child's writing, your comments, pictures, photographs or sentences of things you have made or done). Please reference your child's homework with a title and the homework number it corresponds to. We want your child to be proud of their work so please encourage them to do their best work in all the tasks. Homework books will be given out on **Wednesdays** and need to be bought back to school on **Wednesday** for marking.

1	Self-Portrait Using a mirror, help your child to create a self-portrait using purple mash. Can they talk about any of their features? E.g. nose, mouth, eyes etc.			
2	Physical Physical skills, especially fine motor skills are going to be a big focus this term. Can you practise getting dressed, focussing on buttons and zips? Maybe you could play dressing up, what could you dress up as?			
3	When I Grow Up Can you and your child talk about what they want to be when they grow up? Can your child create their own picture and talk about what they would need to carry out their vocation? These will be displayed in class.			
4	My Family Paint or draw a picture of your family to share with your new friends in class. This could include your house and any pets that you may have.			
5	Nursery Rhymes Choose a rhyme with numbers in it, such as 5 little			

	ducks, 5 currant buns, 5 fat sausages. Make the objects with your child using paper, drawings, cut outs or even the real thing! Be as creative as you can.			
6	<p style="text-align: center;">Numbers</p> <p>When you are out and about at the weekend encourage your child to look out for what numbers they can see around in the environment? Make sure you keep practising counting and recognising numbers to 10!</p>			
7	<p style="text-align: center;">Shape</p> <p>Go on a shape hunt in your house or in the garden? What objects can you find that look like a square, circle, triangle and rectangle? Take a picture of them or draw them.</p>			
8	<p style="text-align: center;">RE - Creation</p> <p>Can your child talk about what God created? E.g. What happened on the the 3rd day? Who were Adam and Eve? Can they draw a picture of their favourite God's Creation e.g. the sun, moon, trees or animals.</p>			

Remember:

1. Homework should be quality time for you and your child to share experiences and to ensure that we are involving you in your child's learning.
2. Have high expectations (you know what your child is capable of)
3. Always praise your child for their efforts.
4. Your child's writing must be written in **pencil**, not pen.
5. Please help and guide your child but do not do it for them.

Sharing experiences such as reading, singing, talking and playing together will all help to ensure that your child enjoys and values learning helping them reach their full potential. **Thank you and have FUN!**
